All Marinview residents are invited to two meetings in November to deal with important neighborhood issues:

1. **Neighborhood Watch Organizational Meeting.**

In response to concerns and expressions of interest by over twenty residents about recent property crimes, the board has decided to hold a meeting to discuss formation of a neighborhood watch committee in Marinview. The Sheriff's office will provide a neighborhood safety expert to advise us. The meeting is scheduled for **November 6** in the Tam Valley Community Center. 2. **Marinview Board Meeting.** Every four months, the board meets to discuss and act upon current issues. The next meeting is scheduled for **November 19** in the TCSD headquarters building. - emergency planning,
