Treasurer's Report

Treasurer's Report

As of mid-September, Marinview has a checking account balance of \$20,135. Expenses to date equaled \$14,117, while dues received from residents totaled \$14,533. Goats were the number one expense at \$5,000. Trail improvements and front entrance maintenance were the next highest expenses at \$4,080 and \$3,421, respectively.

So far, only half of Marinview homes have paid their \$125 annual association dues. That's a shame, as every penny is spent in areas that benefit the entire community. Uncertain if you've paid your dues? Go to www.Marinview.org and click on the "Dues Pymt Status" tab. You'll be

Fire Report

Marinview is working with Southern Marin Fire District (SMFD) to analyze data from the Marin Wildfire Protection Authority's (MWPA's) recent home evaluations. We hope the data (provided at the neighborhood level and NOT by individual homes) illuminates where our community's greatest strengths and weaknesses are with respect to fire danger. Having such information should help in devising strategies/programs to reduce the threat of wildfires. We'll keep you posted on this effort.

Stowing Your Trash Bins After Pickup

Leaving your trash bins out on the curb or driveway apron after pickup day is unsightly and can create a potential traffic hazard, as we have seen them tipped over and contents blown out onto the street on windy days.

In addition, it violates the Covenants,
Conditions, and Restrictions (CC&Rs)¹, which
state that "No weeds, rubbish, debris, objects or
materials of any kind shall be placed or
permitted to accumulate upon any portion of
said Tract, which renders such portion
unsanitary, unsightly, offensive or detrimental to
any property in the vicinity thereof or to the
occupants of any such property."

We all want to keep our community safe and beautiful, so please store your bins in your sheds, garages, or at the rear of your carports.

How Marinview Residents Benefit from the Park System: The Marin Headlands, Golden Gate National Recreation Area (GGNRA), and Mount Tamalpais State Park.

My wife and I moved to Marinview in 2009, partly for the easy access to San Francisco and the nearby towns of Mill Valley and Sausalito but also for the location in the heart of the Marin Headlands. One of the major attractions of life in the North Bay is the proximity to world-class hiking, biking, and nature walking, as well as a neighboring system of parks and trails, including drop-dead views and absolutely beautiful forests and canyons. Marinview is located in the epicenter of the Marin Headlands, and ChatGPT provides an excellent summary of the many unique and wonderful attributes of the headlands as follows:

The Marin Headlands. located at the southernmost end of Marin County, California, is a crown jewel of the Golden Gate National Park. The area is known for its unique geology, fog-swept coastal prairie ecosystem, and its many chapters of history. The headlands offer dramatic cliffs of oceanic rock that provide sweeping views of the Golden Gate Bridge. The land is rich with plants and animals found nowhere else, and the GGNRA contains more endangered species than any other national park in the continental U.S. The Marin Headlands is one of the most visited sites in the national park system, with more than 13 million visitors a year making the pilgrimage to the headlands. In the 1960s, plans were approved by the Marin County Board of Supervisors to build a town in the headlands called Marincello. However, The Nature Conservancy partnered with local citizens and other environmentalists to halt the project, fighting the developer Thomas Frouge and the landowners, Gulf Oil. TNC transferred the land to the National Park Service in 1975 to form the basis for The Golden Gate

National Recreation Area (GGNRA). The GGNRA, which includes Muir Woods and parts of the Mt. Tam trail system, welcomes over 15 million visitors a year across its more than 82,000 acres of coastal and urban lands, north and south of the Golden Gate Bridge.

For anyone who enjoys hiking, biking, or just being in nature, the headlands offers an enormous range and variety of clearly signed and well-maintained trails—a true gift to those who wish to explore and enjoy the natural beauty of the headlands. For residents of Marinview, there is easy access to the trail system via trailheads of Tennessee Valley Road (including a 3.6-mile round-trip trail to Tennessee Valley Beach), County View trailhead, and others. From the County View trailhead, hikers or bikers can easily access the Coyote Ridge Trail, which leads, in turn, to the Coastal Trail, Green Gulch, and multiple other destinations in the park system. In addition to the proximity and easy access to the headlands and GGNRA trails, Marinview has a remarkable system of trails (not as well maintained) linking different parts of the development.
